

Strenna 2025: "Anchored in Hope"



Laura Vicuña was a young Chilean girl who is venerated as Blessed in the Catholic Church. Born on April 5, 1891, in Santiago, Chile, she is remembered for her piety, devotion, and self-sacrifice. Laura's family faced difficult circumstances, and she was educated at a school run by the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians (Salesian Sisters), where she developed a deep spirituality influenced by the teachings of Saint John Bosco.

Her life was marked by a profound commitment to prayer and service, even at a young age. Laura offered her life for the conversion of her mother, who was in a difficult and morally compromising relationship. She passed away on January 22, 1904, at the age of 12, due to a combination of poor health and the sacrifices she made.

Pope John Paul II beatified Laura Vicuña on September 3, 1988, recognizing her heroic virtue and selflessness. She is often seen as a model for young people, particularly for her courage, faith, and dedication to her family and faith. Her feast day is celebrated on January 22.

Sean Devereux was a British humanitarian aid worker and missionary, known for his dedication to helping others, particularly in Africa. Born on November 25, 1964, in Camberley, Surrey, England, he was educated at Salesian College, Farnborough, and later attended the University of Birmingham, where he earned a degree in sports science.

Devereux initially worked as a teacher but felt a strong calling to humanitarian work. He joined the Salesian Lay Missionaries and was sent to Liberia in 1989, where he worked as a teacher and aid worker during the country's civil war. His efforts were focused on providing education and relief to children affected by the conflict.





After his time in Liberia, Devereux joined UNICEF and was posted to Somalia, where he continued his work amid challenging and dangerous conditions. He was deeply committed to improving the lives of children and advocating for peace and justice.

Tragically, Sean Devereux was assassinated on January 2, 1993, in Kismayo, Somalia. His death was a significant loss to the humanitarian community, but his legacy lives on through the work of the Sean Devereux Children's Fund and other initiatives that continue to support education and development in Africa. His life and dedication are remembered as an inspiration to many.




